# 5B Chen Siquan Having Fun with Science







Science is the careful study of structures and behaviours in the physical world. We can also use it for entertainment. Today, let me introduce two fun experiments you can try at home.

For the first experiment, prepare a bottle of cola, a string, a cutter and two bags of Mentos. Then, pass the string through some Mentos and use the cutter to make a small hole on the lid of the cola bottle. Then, submerge the string of Mentos into the cola. Put the lid back as fast as possible. Step back as the Cola will erupt strongly into the air! This experiment is called the Cola and Mentos Eruption.

What's the science? The countless small pores on the surface of the Mentos have a catalytic effect with the soda, releasing the carbon dioxide in it. This causes the rapid eruption of a large amount of foam.

For the second experiment, you need to prepare a balloon, an orange and a small paring knife. First, peel the orange using the paring knife. Then, squeeze the juice in the orange peel on the balloon. You will see how quickly the balloon pops.

What's the science? There is a substance called limonene in orange peel. When it encounters the rubber surface, it will dissolve the rubber and cause the balloon to pop.

I hope you like these two experiments and will try them at home!
