Cupcake recipe

Cupcakes are a delicious snack, and they look beautiful too! Many people love eating them. So today we will teach you how to make tasty peanut butter cupcakes. Yum! First, we need to prepare the ingredients



You will need:

- 400 grams of brown sugar
- 210 grams of peanut butter
- 200ml of milk
- 300 grams of flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon of salt
- 100 grams of butter or margarine
- 1 teaspoon of pure vanilla extract
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon of baking soda

Method:

Preheat the oven to 300 degrees F (175 degrees C). Line a cupcake pan with paper muffin cups.

In a large bowl, mix together the brown sugar, butter and peanut butter until it is light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time, then stir in the vanilla extract. In a separate bowl, combine the flour, baking soda and salt. Stir this mixture into the batter slowly, adding the milk a little bit at a time. When it is all mixed together, spoon the mixture into the paper muffin cups.

Bake for 15 to 20 minutes in the oven until the cupcakes turn into a golden colour. The tops of the cupcakes should spring back up if you touch them gently. Leave them to cool for at least 10 minutes and then put them on a wire rack to cool completely.

If you want to make some icing, mix icing sugar, butter and peanut butter together. Spread it on your cupcakes and use grated chocolate or chopped peanuts to decorate them.



Finally, it is time to eat! Enjoy!

DIY Yummy Slime!

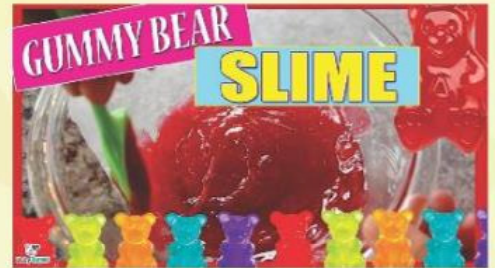

"Have you got the bread?" called Charlie.

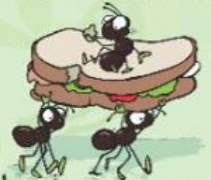
"Here!" "Lettuce?" "All here!"

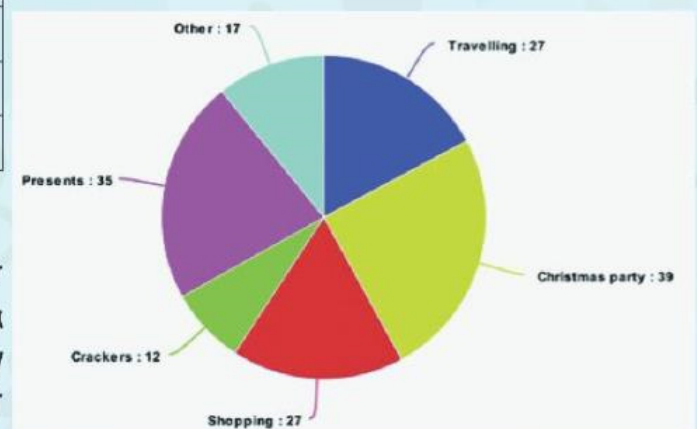

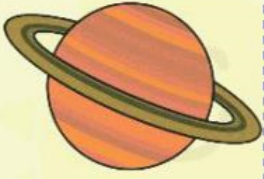
Here is a pie chart to show the results of question 1.

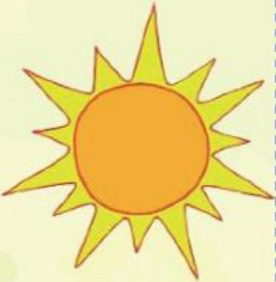
POETRY CORNER
